Hassage Lane Following a ruling in the Court of Appeal, applications to upgrade Restricted Byways to Byways Open To All will not be determined by Somerset County Council. Hassage Lane will remain a Restricted Byway (ie NOT open to motorized traffic).

Flooding at Ringwell Lane The parish council is pressing Somerset Highways to clear the culvert under the A366 at

Ringwell Lane, to avoid a repetition of the recent flooding, particularly to Bridgefoot Cottage.

Planning At its meeting on 12 June the parish council recommended approval of an application for work to a beech tree in a conservation area at Greystones, High Street, Norton St Philip.
